Dear Parents and Carers,

In my last newsletter I shared that we were due to join the Sapientia Trust on 1<sup>st</sup> March 2025. This has been delayed by one month due to administrative issues and should now take place on 1<sup>st</sup> April 2024. We are already working very closely with the Trust and have already benefitted from being part of a big group of schools. Amongst other initiatives, we hosted a Trust training day here at Rosecroft for 200+ staff across the Trust on the first day back, our subject leaders have joined professional networks in their subject with colleagues from other schools and our teaching assistants have joined fellow support staff colleagues for further professional development opportunities. We are looking forward to developing these links further to improve opportunities and outcomes for all of our children.

In the next few weeks we will have some new outdoor gym equipment installed on the school field to enhance our outdoor provision. We are also waiting for a new shed to accommodate some new outdoor toys and breaktime resources. The area outside the Y4 classrooms at the front of the school has been turfed and is being developed into a wellbeing garden for all to use.

Our first residential trip returned today from Norfolk Lakes. Many thanks to Mr Wilson, Mrs Button, Mr Anderson and Mrs Reeve for accompanying the Y4 pupils, looking after them so well and bring them back safely.

You should have received some information about our upcoming parent and carer meetings with teachers. As before these will be held in the hall with opportunities to look at your child's work. ### School trips and visits

We aim to enrich our school curriculum through trips, visitors to school and other similar experiences. These cannot happen without financial support from parents and carers. Whenever a trip or activity is planned, the cost is shared out between the number of children in the year group and this has to be to the penny. We as a school cannot make any profit on this, not even a penny, hence the odd numbers that come out sometimes. This contribution is voluntary and we cannot exclude a child for non-payment. Any family who are in receipt of pupil premium, can request financial support.

What this means in reality is, we rely on parent and carer contributions to enable these trips to happen. Our school budget does not allow for us to fund these opportunities and where a number of contributions have not been paid, we have had to cancel trips as we do not have the financial means to make up any shortfall.

We completely understand that for some families the cost is a lot, especially where there are siblings too. We try now to be mindful of this when booking trips to keep costs down, whilst also giving as much notice as possible to enable families to plan ahead.
